

#### **SPEAKERS**

Laura Hardwicke, M.Ed., AICP, is a transportation professional with 12 years of experience in project management, community-based research, and nonprofit work. Her passion for creating safe, accessible streets for all residents started at Rollins College, where she studied Environmental Science. Laura then earned a Master's in Community Development at Vanderbilt University in Nashville, TN, where she honed her skills working for the consolidated city/county.

In 2020, she returned to her hometown of Orlando to become a Vision Zero Project Manager and lead a variety of exciting projects, including developing the Quick Build Guide and managing LAP projects funded by FDOT and FHWA. Laura is dedicated to empowering communities through data-driven decision-making and community engagement, ensuring that everyone can safely travel their city.





Emily Hanna, AICP, CPM is the Executive Director of Bike/Walk Central Florida (BWCF), a non-profit organization that advocates for bicycle and pedestrian safety, infrastructure, and policy. Prior to BWCF, Emily was the Development Services Manager for the City of Casselberry, overseeing the building department, planning department and the City's CRA, and received the Orlando Business Journal's 2019 40 Under 40 Award for her work in the city.

Emily graduated with her Master's in Urban and Regional Planning from the University of Central Florida in 2015. She serves on several boards including the Orlando Metro Section of APA Florida as the First Vice President, President of the Central Florida chapter of the Florida Planning and Zoning Association, the University of Central Florida Planning Advisory Board, and the Vice Chair of the Seminole County Parks and Preservation Committee. Emily is also an adjunct professor at the University of Central Florida, where she teaches urban and regional planning.

Stephanie Moss serves as the Bicycle & Pedestrian Coordinator for the Florida Department of Transportation in District Five. She is passionate about helping people walk, bike, and drive safely. Stephanie has a BS in Public Administration from Indian River State College, a Project Management Professional Certification, and is a graduate of the FSU Certified Public Manager Program.

She is a member of the Florida Pedestrian & Bicycle Safety Coalition and the Safe Mobility for Life Coalition. Stephanie holds a Road Safety Professional Certificate from the Transportation Professional Certification Board.

Kelly is an advocate for making neighborhoods and towns throughout the state and the country healthier, better connected, more accessible, and more sustainable through meaningful civic engagement and better built environments. She joined the non-profit Florida Bicycle Association in late 2022 as executive director, where she has been focusing programs on making Florida better for people who want to bicycle and for people who need to bicycle.

Kelly is a former senior staff member for an air pollution prevention agency in California and the former executive director of the national Walkable and Livable Communities Institute. For the past 16 years, she has lived in Winter Garden, where she has done volunteer work to create safer and more people-friendly infrastructure. In 2021, she was recognized as the Citizen Transportation Advocate of the Year by the Women in Transportation Seminar of Central Florida. And today, she will present some of the work which earned that award.

### **SPEAKERS**

Jon holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in **Criminal Justice Administration from** Columbia College and is a graduate of both the Florida Department of Law Enforcement's Senior Leadership Program, and the Southern Police Institutes 53rd Command Officers Development Course. Jon has served in public safety and promoted traffic safety for more than three decades. He retired as a Captain from the Winter Park Police Department after serving more than 25 years. Jon has instructed and trained law enforcement around the country with the International Association of Directors of Law **Enforcement Standards and Training, and** assisted with development of the training program related to Pedestrian & Bicycle Safety for High Visibility Enforcement contracts.

Jon has served as an instructor for the Florida Attornev General's Crime Prevention Training Institute, and held the designations is Crime Prevention Through **Environmental Design Practitioner** certified through the Florida Attorney General's Office, which many times focuses on way finding and increasing safety for pedestrians and cyclists in local communities. Jon currently serves as the Florida Law Enforcement Liaison Program's District 5 LEL and contributes as an active member on the State's Pedestrian & Bicycle Safety Coalition. In his role as an LEL, he encourages law enforcement agencies across Central Florida to participate in National, State, and local traffic safety enforcement campaigns.
