5. Road Safety Audit Update (Georganna Gillette)

Ms. Gillette stated that the 2016 Dangerous By Design report ranked Brevard County 2nd in the Nation as the most dangerous for pedestrians. The SCTPO has conducted some studies through the Pedestrian, Bicycle Safety Action Plan which covered 5 corridors and revealed over 190 issues. The SCTPO is going to work with the specific municipalities and the FDOT to work through the issues by a case to case basis and utilize the safety funds first.
